## FALL 2026 REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

PLEASE NOTE: YOU MAY TAKE ONLY ONE WORKSHOP PER SEMESTER.  
YOU MAY TAKE TWO SEMINARS PER SEMESTER.

### **Beginning Workshops & Seminars**

There are no prerequisites and no application necessary for beginning workshops or seminars. If the class is full, add your name to the waitlist in Vergil and be sure to attend on the first day.

### **Open Workshops**

Open Workshops were formerly called “Intermediate” and “Advanced” Workshops. There are no longer applications required to register for these classes. The only prerequisite is that **the student must have taken at least one Beginning Workshop in any genre.**

### **Senior Workshops**

Senior Workshops are capstone classes in the major. You do not need to take a Senior Workshop to complete the major. Acceptance into the workshop requires the approval of the professor, and preference is given to senior majors. **Applications for Senior Workshops are due on Friday, August 28 at 4:00pm ET.**

#### **1. Prepare a Writing Sample**

Senior Fiction            20-25 pages of fiction (double-spaced; could be several pieces)

#### **2. Submit Writing Sample with Application Form**

You will be **informed of your status**—approved, waitlisted or not accepted—before the first class.
